OFFICIAL MINUTES

Local Union Council Meeting Mail Handlers Local 300 111 John Street, Room 710 New York, NY 10038

The Local Union Council held on Wednesday, June 11, 2014 was called to order at 10:06am. The meeting proceeded with the reading of the minutes from the last Council Meeting held on November 13, 2013.

MOTION-by Howard, 2nd by-Licata, "To accept the Minutes as read."

Passed-Unanimous.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Opening the meeting LP Hogrogian introduced incoming JFK Branch President Lucy Lombardo to the Council who was there as an observer. Members of the Council also wished outgoing JFK Branch President Stan Howardthe best in his future endeavors.

Moving forward, over the course of the meeting Local President Hogrogian provided the Council with discussions and reviews on various important issues that included:

- A review of the USPS service standards.
- A status report on the declining Regular and Associate Membership complement.
- A status report on the Mail Handler Assistants (MHAs) including orientations, hours of work and overtime issues, and included a discussion on the MHA reappointments and conversions.
- The next training session for <u>"new"</u> Shop Stewards and for new Arbitration Advocate. (Planned for year 2015.
- An update and discussion on the Steward's list, and Arbitration schedule.
- A discussion on the Local 300 Officer's Election (2014) that included the ballot count scheduled for June 18, 2014 and the Installation of officers scheduled for July 17, 2014.

- An update on <u>Withholding/Northeast Area-wide</u>. Withholding remains in the Triboro district Connecticut, and Northern NJ.
- A discussion on the <u>Retirement Seminars</u> conducted by Federal Prep. Members can check with their Branch Presidents for a schedule.
- An update on <u>Installation Excessing/Function 4 Reviews and Consolidations</u>. Events include: Staten Island AMP, Mid-Hudson AMP, Stamford AMP, Kilmer AMP, Monmouth AMP and the Brooklyn outgoing mail. Further discussions included JFK, Flushing, Teterboro and NJ L&DC.Orange, NJ, Summit, NJ, Port Washington, NY and Westport, CT.
- An update on <u>Retreat Rights.</u> Bronx- Mail Handlers still retain retreat rights. Paterson NJ- Approximately 20 Mail Handlers still holding retreat rights.
- An update on <u>Casual in Lieu Grievances</u> to include: CILO settlements in NJ /NDC, NYC, ---and the NY/ L & DC. Mid-Hudson has (2 settlements). CILO's in JFK, Flushing and DVD. The NJ L&DC prevailed with a \$1.6 million settlement.
- An update on <u>Local Negotiations</u> that included Western Nassau prevailing with successful language added to the LMOU. The Mid Island negotiations continues.
- •An update on the <u>Ergonomics program</u>. There will be one (1) site per District. The program is now underway in Riverhead.
- A discussion the <u>Priority Mail Decentralization</u> plans which included destination areas and possible complement impacts.
- An update on any pending <u>Litigation Reports</u>. The President reports that there are no litigations cases pending at this time.

Over the course of the meeting, Local Treasurer Tabarus provided the Council with reports consisting of balance sheets, fiscal comparisons, revenue stream changes, the MHBP, expenses covering Conventions, meetings, conferences and arbitrations. Kevin also discussed declining income from regular and associate dues and continued with a discussion on the MHA"S connection to the revenue stream.

The LT continued to discuss and review various other matters including:

- A review of the COLA schedule as well as General Wage increases applicable to the Mail Handler wage scale.
- <u>Web Site/Newsletter</u>: The website is frequently being updated. Deadline for articles of interest is August 2014.
- An update on the various <u>Scholarship programs</u> available to our members. Information can be found on our Local 300 website.
- An update on the Mets trip in August 2014.
