Minutes of January 15, 2026.

1) Moment of silence:

2) Reading of minutes from October 16, 2025, LUC Meeting. Additions and corrections:

Page 1. LP report, item i, add "for Health insurance, FSA and FEDVIP" after Open Season.

Page 2. VP report, item e, change "there" to "their"

Page 3. NYSEBM report, take out "ing" and add "ed" to Attend.

**Motion** to accept the minutes NJS Russo 2<sup>nd</sup> by BP Prieto. Abstain LT Sanchez and BP Evans. Passed majority.

3) President's Report-Johnson,

- Provided a detailed written report on her duties and activities.
- LP introduced a new policy for the LUC: AI (artificial intelligence) generated grievances are not to be filed under any circumstances.
- Safety meetings should be scheduled in each facility to discuss accidents and emergencies (anyone should be able to contact 911) and also express to management that postal police on sites should be aware of all sections in the building so they can respond quickly.
- LP announced that next week she, along with VP Bermudez, NJS Russo and BP Chery are traveling to Nashville, TN to see the PILS machines at that location.
- Branch monthly grievance log is to be given to LP.
- New stewards training will be scheduled for July 2026.
- LP said that when the new contract is completed, an LMOU training will be set up for the LUC.
